

# Double Needle Cast-on

Stitches that are cast on using this method result in a firm and even knitted edge.

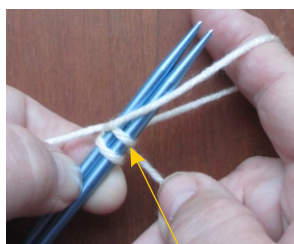

left hand loop

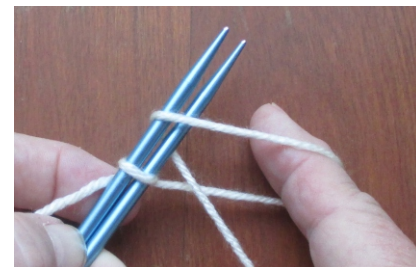


Knit the stitches as desired. [Diagram #8](#) shows one row of knitting. Notice that the bottom edge of the cast on stitches is firm and very even.

right hand loop

Place the tightened loop over two needles. Next, loop the right hand yarn end over the doubled needles to match [Diagram #4](#). Do not tighten the loop. Then loop the left hand yarn end around the needles. Finally, pass the right hand loop over the top of the needles, and tighten the loop ([Diagram #5](#)).

Repeat steps [#4](#) and [#5](#) until you have the desired number of stitches on the needles ([Diagram #6](#)).

Remove one of the needles ([Diagram #7](#)) and holding the bottom end of the stitches, spread the stitches along the length of the needle. This will also tighten the cast-on stitches.
